The Monrovia Chamber held the first Monrovia Works Program in May 2007, local business people moved from class to class and spoke the students at both Clifton and Santa Fe Middle Schools. Participating business people said the program was a rewarding experience and that they would gladly participate again.

The Chamber is currently coordinating the Monrovia Works Program for Tuesday, May 27 at Santa Fe Middle School and Thursday, May 29 at Clifton Middle School. The Monrovia Works Program requires approximately thirty business people to volunteer about an hour and a half of their time to speak to the students.

Each speaker will have 10 minutes for their presentation and another 10 minutes for discussion and question and answer period. The business people speak to the students about the positions they hold, what they find interesting about their positions, the salary range, how they decided on their career choice and what education path is needed to acquire such a position.

The goal of the program is to capture the interest of our students early and get them actively thinking and working toward their future job and college readiness, this in turn will benefit everyone.
