The Census: A Snapshot

What: The census is a count of everyone residing in the United States.

Who: All U.S. residents must be counted—people of all races and ethnic groups, both citizens and non-citizens.

When: Census Day is April 1, 2010. Questionnaire responses should represent the household as it exists on this day.

More detailed socioeconomic information will be collected annually from a small percentage of the population through the American Community Survey.

Why: The U.S. Constitution requires a national census once every 10 years. The census will show state population counts and determine representation in the U.S. House of Representatives.

How: Census questionnaires will be delivered or mailed to households via U.S. mail in March 2010; many households will receive a replacement questionnaire in early April. Census workers also will visit households that do not return questionnaires.

A Complete Count: The Importance of Census Data

Every year, the federal government can allocate more than \$400 billion to states and communities based, in part, on census data.

Census data guide planning for new hospitals, roads, job training centers, schools and more.

Census data are used to determine the need for additional social services, block grants and other grant programs essential to many communities.

Census data inform a diverse range of local initiatives, from justifying the need for an after-school program to designating urban revitalization areas.

2010 Census Questionnaire: Quick, Easy and Confidential

With only 10 questions, the 2010 Census questionnaire is one of the shortest questionnaires in history and takes just 10 minutes to complete.

By law, the Census Bureau cannot share an individual's census questionnaire responses with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities.

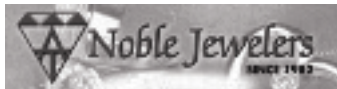

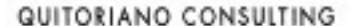

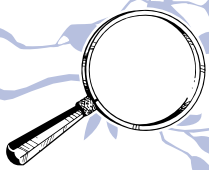

NEWS AROUND TOWN

Despite the economy, some businesses are still expanding, good news for Monrovia. The Metro Gold Line Extension saga continues.

A new Living Spaces store to open in Monrovia. The vacant Expo property at Huntington Drive and Mayflower Avenue will become the new home of Living Spaces and Paul's TV; this will be their fifth store in Southern California. The existing building is about 88,000 square feet and rumor has it that Living Spaces will spend about 5 million to make the location suitable for their needs. The target date of opening has not been announced. Congratulations are due to Redevelopment Division Manager Kevin O'Brien and his team for getting this building reoccupied so quickly and cost-effectively.

Kohl's to hire 1,800 in L.A. Area

Here's some good news for job seekers: Kohl's is opening 12 locations in the Los Angeles area next month and is planning to hire 1,800 employees to fill the stores.

Local job seekers are encouraged to apply for associate positions, including customer service, cash register operation and early-morning stocking. New hires will receive benefits that include health insurance and merchandise discounts.

New store locations are in Cypress, Downey, Fullerton, Huntington Beach, Los Angeles, Monrovia, Northridge, Redondo Beach, Sun Valley, Tustin, Upland and Whittier.

Job fairs are scheduled for this week, through Thursday. Applicants should visit www.kohls Careers.com or call (877) 639-5645 to schedule an interview and to obtain additional information.

Kohl's is opening 30 California stores this fall, increasing the number in the state to 121.

T. Phillips Ale House and Grill coming this fall to 601 S. Myrtle Ave., received

approval for a Conditional Use Permit for alcohol sales from the Monrovia Planning Commission. T. Phillips has locations in La Verne and Glendora and is currently undergoing tenant improvements for their newest location in Old Town Monrovia.

Courtyards at Old Town Continues. The construction continues on the Courtyards at Old Town project, in fact, we have been seeing the bathtubs arriving this week. The street improvements on Myrtle Avenue also continue and have added a bit of traffic to the south end of town. Remember the street improvements also include an over-the-street wrought iron sign welcoming visitors to Old Town.

Metro Gold Line Extension News...if you can call it that, the MTA Board has acknowledged the need and obligation to construct the Gold Line (segment 1A through Azusa, at least). The problem is that, until a location for Metro's desired maintenance and operations facility can be determined, they will not accelerate the project schedule. Under current conditions, the line would not be operational until 2017. There is once again talk that at the MTA Board meeting on September 24 the project will be put on the Long Range Transportation Plan, San Gabriel Valley Chamber's of Commerce continue to attend the meetings in support of the project – stay tuned.

CITY OF HOPE AGAIN RANKS AMONG THE NATION'S BEST IN BOTH CANCER & UROLOGY

City of Hope has once again been named one of "America's Best Hospitals" in two specialties by U.S. News & World Report. City of Hope ranked 22nd on this year's list of top cancer hospitals and 36th on the list for urology.

The institution is the second-highest ranked hospital in the Los Angeles area and one of only seven centers in California to appear on the cancer list. In

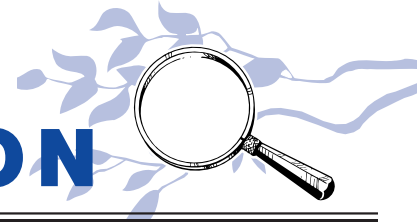
urology, City of Hope is one of seven hospitals in California, and one of only four on the Los Angeles area, to be ranked.

"We are very pleased to once again be ranked among the very best centers in the country for cancer and urology," said Michael A. Friedman, M.D., president and chief executive officer. "To earn this national recognition for the sixth year is a fitting honor for our entire team of dedicated physicians, research scientists, nurses and employees who demonstrate every day the highest commitment to excellence and innovation on patient care."

City of Hope's status as home to the state's largest prostate cancer program (according to data from the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development) contributes to its high ranking in urology, administrators said. The institution also is a recognized leader in laparoscopic and robotic-assisted laparoscopic prostate surgeries. Since 2003, City of Hope physicians have performed more urologic oncology procedures than any single institution on the U.S., including more robotic-assisted prostatectomies and radical cystectomies than any other center in the West.

"We recognize that the most important part of our mission to cure cancer is to provide help to the patients who come to us. A patient is not just his or her disease, but an individual with a range of needs to be addressed outside of the cancer itself," said Alexandra Levine, M.D., chief medical officer. "This honor reaffirms our patient-centered approach to medicine and the excellence that our patient care teams deliver on a regular basis to support the patient and his or her family clinically, as well as emotionally, psychologically and socially."
